Beloved in Christ,

We often think of summer as a time for rest, relaxation, and vacation. Yet every year I am amazed at how busy things can be at Christ Church during the summer – often below the surface. Summer is a rich season of preparation.

Already, preparation has begun for our 157<sup>th</sup> Calvert County Jousting Tournament, on Saturday, 31 August (this year, on Labor Day weekend). Attic Treasures arrive in the shed almost every day. Behind-the-scenes prep has begun for dinners – both sit-down and box suppers to go. Phone calls come in asking for details. The tempo will only pick up as the summer goes on.

We're looking forward to several fellowship Sundays, with combined worship services at 9:15 a.m., on the last Sundays in June (30th), July (28th), August (25th), and September (29th). We'll worship together at 9:15, and then gather in the Parish Hall for fellowship and hospitality. Please let the office know if you would like to help with hospitality on any of those Sundays. (Weather permitting, on 30 June *only*, we'll worship outdoors, on the Tournament Field, as did during CoViD in 2020 and 2021: remember to BYO lawn chair).

The profile and search teams have begun their work, trying to discern God's will for leadership for our parish in the years ahead. Please pray for them daily: Almighty God, giver of every good gift: Look graciously on your Church, and so guide the minds of those who shall choose a rector for this parish, that we may receive a faithful pastor, who will care for your people and equip us for our ministries; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. We hope to be able to share updates of the search process during hospitality time on the summer fellowship Sundays in June, July, and August.

For my own part, I'm beginning to wrap up loose ends from the past seven years: finishing projects that I began and preparing notes so that the next rector has a place to begin. As I write down details of a rector's ministry in this place, I am grateful for the incredible gifts that so many of you offer so generously to our life together. And I am mindful of the steady pulse of God's love – that you make visible and live out in our life together.

# MESSAGE FROM DEACON BETH

Several years ago I wrote an article for the Bell outlining my duties as your Deacon. I believe it is time for a "refresher course" now that we have gotten to know each other a lot better as time has passed.

My responsibilities are not just to serve Fr. Christopher at the alter but to serve you, the family of Christ, as well. A Deacon wears her (or his) stole over the left shoulder so the right hand is always free to serve. I serve you by always being available for prayer, to bring communion to you at home if you are unable to come to Church, and to be at the hospital to pray with you and your family prior to surgery and to sit with your love ones during surgery. If you are in the hospital because of illness I can come to visit you, pray with you, and bring you communion if it is allowed.

However, as I have learned over the years, I am unaware of your various circumstances until long after they have occurred and that saddens me. Even if you don't want a visit I can always pray. God does listen.

My phone is always on until 10:30 PM. You can reach me via phone call or text at 407-256-3298.

Please don't be afraid to ask me for prayer or help in anyway. This is what I signed on to do when I was ordained almost 19 years ago. The role of a Deacon is to bring the world to the Church and the Church to the world.

I pray God continues to fill you and your families with His unlimited peace and grace.

- Popcorn


# What you do:


- 1. Carefully thread a yard of floss through the needle.
