



The sermons for the next two Sunday's will arise from the Gospel and further develop the theme of "Becoming Beloved Community."

While Martin Luther King, Jr., popularized the concept of Beloved Community, it was Harvard philosophy professor, Josiah Royce, who first developed the idea of Beloved Community. In 2013, Royce wrote, "My life means nothing, either theoretically or practically, unless I'm a member of community." Royce believed that, in addition to the actual communities we inhabit, there is an ideal "beloved community" that comprises all who are dedicated to loyalty and truthfulness.

Royce's thinking is both reminiscent of the African concept of Ubuntu, I am because we all are, and also congruent with Thich Nhat Hanh's core belief that all life and all things are interconnected. With his friend, Thich Nhat Hanh, Martin Luther King, Jr., further developed Royce's notion of Beloved Community.

"Becoming Beloved Community" is a vision of the Episcopal Church that arises from the Bible's most important commandments: to love God and love our neighbors, in whom we see the face of God. The promise and hope of "Becoming Beloved Community" is that we grow together as children of God who love as God intends us to love...across differences and disagreements.

CROSS CRAFT

Make this special cross as a reminder of Jesus' death and resurrection.



What you need:

- Adult help
- Piece of wood
- 5 nails
- Hammer
- 2 balls of yarn (blue and yellow)

What you do:

- 1. Hammer the nails into the wood to form a cross shape (see example).
- 2. Tie the blue yarn to the bottom nail. Wrap it up and around the top nail and back down to the bottom nail. Then wrap it around the middle nail and around the side nails. Repeat until the yarn is wrapped about halfway up the exposed nails.
- 3. Repeat step two with the yellow yarn. Wrap it around the nails until only the heads are visible.



SUNRISE SURPRISE


The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

What you need:

- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ½ cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

What you do:

- Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls.
 Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- 6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center just like Jesus' empty tomb!

Search Committee Update

The rector search closed on February 20, 2025. Priority was given to applications eccived by January 15, 2025. Applications were received before and after that priority deadline.
